Caption Judges

George York Served as Band Director at Eureka HS from 1971-1976. Band Director at Illinois Valley Central HS 76-77 and Director of Music Education Unit 5 Schools from 1977 until retirement. During his time as Band Director at Normal Community HS the Band performed at the Cotton Bowl, King Orange Jamboree, Fiesta Bowl, Citrus Bowl and the Tournament of Roses Parades. The Band has also performed in Canada, Mexico, and Europe.

Dr. F. Mack Wood is currently the Associate Director of Bands and Director of the Big Red Marching Machine at Illinois State University. Prior to this appointment, he was a Graduate Assistant at the University of Miami, Frost School of Music and Louisiana State University. Dr. Wood taught high school in the Dallas area of Texas for 11 years before moving on to graduate school. He earned a bachelor's degree in music education from The University of Texas at Austin where he also served as the drum major of Longhorn Band for 2 years. During his free time, Dr. Wood enjoys spending time with his wife, daughter, 2 dogs, and his grills.

Alex Kaminsky is Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at VanderCook College of Music. He holds degrees from the University of Florida and Indiana University, is active as an adjudicator, and is in demand as a guest conductor/clinician across the country. Prior to coming to VanderCook, Kaminsky's high school bands performed at many prestigious events and national conferences including the American Bandmasters Association, College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, Music for All National Concert Band Festival, Carnegie Hall, and 4 times at the Midwest Clinic. Professor Kaminsky's marching bands consistently placed in the Florida Marching Band State Championship Finals, winning the FMBC State Championship 4 of his last 6 years as a high school band director, as well as placing in finals at BOA regional competitions.

TJ Mack is in his first year serving as the Assistant Director of Bands at Illinois State University. Previously, he was a Graduate Teaching Assistant at The Ohio State University where he completed his Master's Degree in Wind Conducting. TJ taught 5th through 12th grade band in both public and private school settings for six years in Northwest Illinois. He previously served on the board of directors for the Rockford Wind Ensemble and has enjoyed many opportunities as a guest conductor, judge, and clinician.

Dr. Ben Stiers has been on the faculty of the Illinois State University School of Music since 2011. He teaches applied percussion and music theory and has previously served as assistant director and acting director of the ISU Big Red Marching Machine, instructor and arranger for the PULSE Drumline, and director of the ISU Pep Band. Prior to his time at ISU, Ben served as Instructor of Percussion at Centre College in Danville, KY. He holds degrees in Music Performance from the University of Kentucky, the University of Nevada-Las Vegas, and Illinois State University. An active performer, clinician, and adjudicator, Ben is an artist-endorser for Innovative Percussion, Inc., and Grover Pro Percussion.

Chuck Cummings has been active in Drum Corps, Marching Band, Color Guard and Winter Guard activities since 1982. He is the Executive Director of Independence Winter Guards and has been a 2 time Vice President, the Publicity Director and has assisted with many Educational trainings in the Midwest Color Guard Circuit. Chuck has also been the Director/Choreographer for many Illinois High School band/guard programs such as Marian Catholic High School, Lake Park High School, Naperville North High School, Naperville Central high School and Andrew High School. As well, he has facilitated numerous Clinics and Educational events over the years. Chuck works full time in the Medical Field providing services for individuals recovering from illness and/or injury and has volunteered with many Special Olympics programs.


David Morrison built and maintained a nationally recognized band program at Prospect High School in Mt. Prospect, Illinois, for nearly three decades. Under his direction, both the Symphonic and Marching Bands consistently achieved top honors at state and national competitions, including as the Illinois SuperState Honor Band, Bands of America Regional Champions, and multiple-time Grand National Finalists. In addition to performances for both Presidents Ronald Reagan and George W. Bush, the bands also participated in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade and the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California. Following his tenure at Prospect, Mr. Morrison worked as an adjunct faculty member at several colleges and universities. He also served as interim conductor at Illinois Wesleyan University and director of bands at the University of Illinois, Chicago, thereby completing a cycle of teaching that encompassed every level of music student, from beginner through college graduate. Some of Mr. Morrison's honors include the Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association, the John Paynter Lifetime Achievement Award, and the John Philip Sousa Foundation Legion of Honor Award. In 2003, Mr. Morrison was honored as the State of Illinois teacher of the year, and in 2005 he was inducted into the Phi Beta Mu Bandmasters Hall of Fame at Northwestern University. He has been published in numerous music education periodicals and has present at the Midwest Clinic International Band and Orchestra Conference in Chicago, Illinois. Mr. Morrison remains active as a quest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator in the United States and abroad.

You Be the Judge

If this is your first marching band competition, perhaps the following will help you understand how the bands are evaluated and scored. Each contest elects to use a certain scoring system. Following is the system that will be used tonight.

Three judges are in the press box judging each band in these first two categories.

Music General Effect - 400 points (2 judges)

This category involves the collective presentation of all elements in support of the overall musical performance. Consideration of what performers are required to do is critical in determining their level of performance success and achievement. Subcategories include Repertoire Effectiveness and Showmanship Effectiveness.

Visual General Effect – 200 points

This category involves the collective presentation of all elements in support of the overall visual performance. Performers will be evaluated with the understanding that content and demand is an integral component of the evaluation of execution in determining the overall level of performance achievement.

Two judges will be evaluating in the following categories at the field level. Individual Music Performance – 200 points

Evaluation of content and demand is an integral component of the evaluation of execution in determining the overall level of performance achievement. Consideration of what performers are required to do is critical in determining their level of performance success and achievement. Subcategories include Tone Quality, Intonation, Accuracy, and Definition.

Individual Visual Effect – 200 points

Evaluation of content and demand is an integral component of the evaluation of execution in determining the overall level of performance achievement. Consideration of what performers are required to do is critical in determining their level of performance success and achievement. Subcategories include Technique, Excellence in Movement, and Visual Artistry.

All five judges' scores added together will be the band's score for their performance. In the case of a tie, the highest average of the scores from the three music categories will determine the outcome.

Caption Awards

Two separate judges will be judging the individual captions of auxiliaries (press box) and percussion (on field). *These judges' scores will not be figured into the points for placement of the bands*, only for the awarding of the caption awards in each class. These judges will give specific comments to these individual areas to assist the students in the advancement of their performance proficiency and effect toward the band's product.

A third caption award for best winds will be given to the group in each class with the highest total music score from the three music judges.

Now that you know how the judging works, have fun trying your hand at judging the bands for yourself!
